Reflection on Today's Scripture Readings by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

There is a "dream factory" inside each one of us that produces items that delight us, and at other times scare us, and even warn us. St. Joseph, for example, is a prime example of experiencing the latter, followed by the wise men whose story is read today. As the three of them give us pause as we hear their story again on the Epiphany, we conjure up their exotic wardrobe, trained camels richly saddled, and their precious gifts. But their story is not without the apprehension that evil lurking in the wings causes. In this instance, the good intentions of the visitors are threatened by a scheming neurotic tyrant named Herod.

What offers the wise men warning is their shared dream. So their appearance in the Bible ends as quietly as it began. They mount their camels and set out for their homeland, as Matthew puts it, "by another way."


First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6

The prophet speaks of the glorious New Zion, a splendid restoration of all Israel. The wealth of the world will come to her, and even foreign kings will bow down to her.

Second Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3A, 5-6 Paul's great insight is that the Gentiles are full participants in the Church. By mentioning the apostles, the author reminds his readers of the Church's solid foundation.

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-2

The story of the wise men's visit to the Infant Lord brings together elements of wonder and deceit, along with love. The three gifts, causing us to think of a party of three, may have been inspired by Matthew's knowledge of today's passage from Isaiah.

Dear Parishioners and Friends of the Parish,

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord.

The Magi represent Gentiles—all people outside the Jewish world. On the feast of the Epiphany, we celebrate the fact that Jesus is revealed not just to the Jewish people, but to the world. Like the Magi, we search for Jesus. When he is revealed to us, we respond by offering gifts—that which is most valuable to us—to Jesus.

Three mysteries are encompassed in this solemnity: the adoration of the Christ Child by the Magi, the Baptism of Christ and the wedding feast at Cana. The Crib will have a new look, replacing the shepherds with the three Magi and their gifts.

Then, on Monday, January 8th, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. We end the season of Christmas. On January 9th, we start the Ordinary Time in our liturgical calendar. OT continues through Tuesday, 13 February, the day before Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten Season.

At His baptism at the water of Jordan, Jesus receives the affirmation from the Father to start His mission on earth, to gather humanity back to His Father, to bring heaven on earth.

During this time, the parish continues to reflect the mystery of Christ and honor its fullness especially on Sundays. We eagerly share to our brothers and sisters of Christ's mission of building the followers of Jesus into one family of God here in SRHAP.

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated in our parish on (usually) the first, third, and fourth Sunday of each month (except Palm Sunday, Easter Sunday, and the solemnities of the Nativity of the Lord and of Mary the Holy Mother of God). The first and third Sunday are at 1:00 (in St. Raphael Church). The fourth Sunday is during the 11:30 Mass. Before the parish office can schedule a date for baptism, the child's parents must give us the sponsor-eligibility certificate for either (a) the intended godparent or (b) one of the two intended godparents (if there are to be two godparents, i.e., a godfather and a godmother, with the second godparent's certificate to be presented by the Monday preceding the baptism). (The sponsor certificate certifies that the intended godparent is a Catholic who meets the requirements to be a sponsor.) To facilitate this process, you may wish to call the parish office around four or five months before your unborn child's due date. (Please do not reserve a restaurant, until after you have booked the baptism date with the parish office.) Please feel free to contact our parish's part-time, baptism coordinator, Mrs. Alice Bolton, in the parish office.

Leading Teens Closer To Christ!

MARANATHA! HEARTOGOO

It seems to be going so quickly this year (or do we say that every year?) With Thanksgiving only just over we are already looking towards the Christmas season and so, it is not shocking to hear people say, "Where is the time going?" St. Paul reminds us that for The Lord, "a day is like a thousand years" (and vice versa). He reminds us of the difference between Kairos and Chronos. Because we generally exist in Chronos (sequential time), we tend to allow for abuses such as procrastination, tardiness, lethargy etc. but in Kairos ('Gods Time') there is no room for such abuses. St Paul tells us, we must wait for the coming of the new heaven and new earth and be eager to be found without blemish and at peace. In Kairos we cannot afford to procrastinate, we must grow in virtue today, we must repent, and we must commit to these things and allow His grace to change us! There are parallels throughout our readings between God and us, Heaven and earth, time and timelessness. Advent is a great time for change. As a season it affords us a little time to repent, to convert, to wait and to prepare. But what are we waiting for? What are we preparing for? We are waiting to receive the coming of The King of Glory. As a youth minister I often ask the teens I minister to if they are outwardly Christian or inwardly Christian, if the manifestation of their faith lives are resplendent throughout their daily lives and not simply in their Life Teen lives. We know how difficult it is to be an evangelist and how we are all given different gifts. Yet one way for all of us to measure our evangelization skills is to view our face book posts. How do we look in the photos we post, how do we dress, what message are we sending? True Repentance means turning away from the world and even away from ourselves. We can follow the example of the saints and be reminded that our life is not simply about us, it is a gift from God, given that we might love Him and our neighbor. True repentance is about love and that means patient, selfless, humble acts of love throughout the course of our daily timelines, so that we might enjoy our blessed inheritance in when He comes for us....in His Time.
